Breakfast at Liz's Where Y'at Diner - Liz spreads sunshine at her delightful eatery with a menu featuring Louisiana specialties like Grits and Grillades and Bananas Foster Waffles.

Explore the pristine Honey Island Swamp - Tour the Honey Island Swamp where wildlife is abundant. You never know when you'll spot alligators, deer, raccoons, egrets and more.

Lunch at Palmettos on the Bayou - Delight in Louisiana specialties and upscale Creole cuisine on beautiful Bayou Bonfouca.

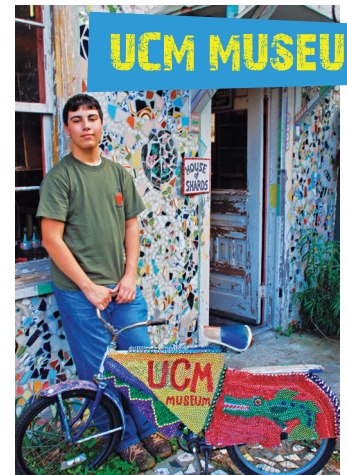
Tour the eclectic Abita Springs - Check out the fun and quirky town of Abita Springs. First stop, **Abita Mystery House** at the **UCM Museum**. This museum is home to a collection including outsider art and interactive vignettes of Southern life. Then, visit the plaza/tourist park and **Abita Trailhead Museum** which serves as a visitor center for the adjacent **Tammany Trace**, and as a history and art museum.

Abita Beer Tasting - On the way to Covington, stop by the **Abita Brewery** for a tour and tasting of the famous Abita Beer. Despite incredible growth, this company's corporate office is still in St. Tammany Parish.

Street strolling in downtown Covington - Head to downtown Covington and tour the shops, galleries and more. Don't forget to check out the antiques and boutiques on **Lee Lane**.

Dinner at Del Porto - Dine at one of the best-rated Italian restaurants in the area and sample some favorites including the soul-satisfying antipasto.

Mandeville Lakefront - Giant oaks along Mandeville's lakefront are iconic for this old and lovely town on the north shore of Lake Pontchartrain.

MADISONVILLE LIGHTHOUSE



Lake Pontchartrain Maritime Museum in Madisonville - Visitors to the museum find rich maritime history. While in Madisonville, you can fish or crab off the pier, enjoy the sunset or, looking due west, see the **Madisonville Lighthouse**, built in 1838.

Tammany Trace - a 31-mile rails-to-trails conversion along a beautiful scenic path can put your mind at ease. Hike, bike or simply walk the Tammany Trace, with trailheads located throughout the parish.

Morton's Seafood Restaurant in Madisonville - Just walking distance from the **Maritime Museum**, Morton's Seafood Restaurant offers fun and delicious cuisine in a great atmosphere - on the banks of the Tchefuncte River.

Global Wildlife Center in Folsom - Visit Global Wildlife Center and see animals up close and personal. Feed a baby giraffe or pet a camel. Experience a wildlife safari from a covered wagon.

Pontchartrain Vineyards in Bush - Experience the sophisticated wines from Pontchartrain Vineyards. Sample wines including Le Trolley.

La Provence in Lacombe - A Northshore landmark operated by chef John Besh, La Provence offers French cuisine at its best.
